### Are you a freshman or a transfer student?

- Apply as a freshman if:
  - The applicant has graduated high school in the same calendar year as their entry term to the University **or**
  - The applicant has completed no other post-high school credit
    - An applicant who has never attended college after high school is considered freshman, no matter how long ago they may have attend high school
- Apply as a transfer student if:
  - An applicant has taken college credit during or after the fall term following high school graduation.
    - An applicant who graduates from high school in the spring and takes college course during the summer before enrolling at UMC in the fall will be considered freshman, since they are entering in the same year as their high school graduation
